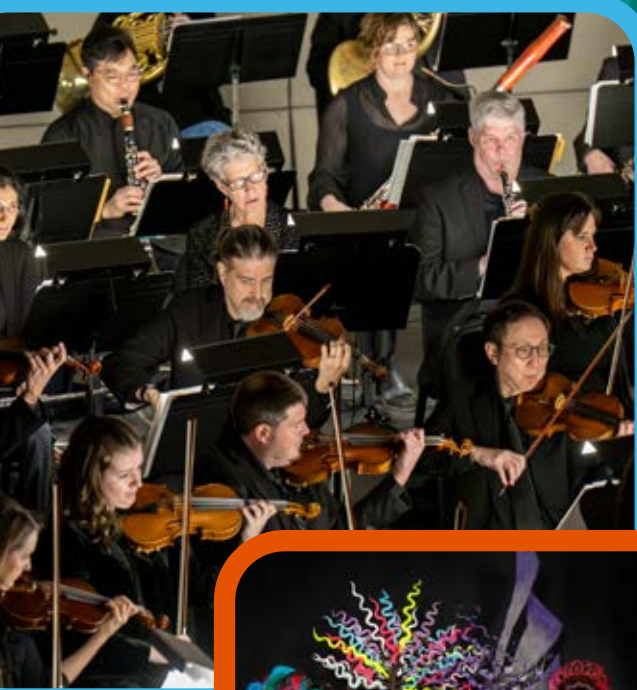


Arts & ENTERTAINMENT

LOCAL TOURS

Downtown Binghamton Freedom Trail

Each stop is dedicated to influential locations and people within the Binghamton Community who were essential pieces in the abolition of slavery and securing civil rights in the United States. This trail strives to be an educational and insightful experience for all and puts the our civil rights heroes at the forefront.

iDistricts Murals and Mosaics

The Greater Binghamton area has a rich culture and a deep-rooted history. This combination makes for a fruitful space for artists to grow and create. Two media the artists of Binghamton use are murals and mosaics, which can be found in various places throughout the streets of downtown.

PAST – Binghamton History Walking Tour

This short walking tour includes numerous historic buildings and city landmarks in only a few blocks. Feel free to edit the tour and create your own version based on your schedule and interests.

Women's Suffrage Trail

The right to vote was made possible by the strong-willed women of the U.S.A., and some of them resided right here in New York State. Broome and Tioga Counties are one of the historic areas where women made change, and stood strong in their beliefs to give all women the right to vote.

Sculpture Tour

Many of these public sculptures bear the scars of change, but still they stand: meaningful public sculptures that serve as community touchstones of past glories, current realities and future promise.

Haunted History Trail

The Haunted History Trail of New York State is where you can plan your next ghostly adventure. Learn about the lives that once walked before us at one of their many locations across New York, including Greater Binghamton.
